COURSE OVERVIEW

This course examines how movement and animation are created through the use of sequential images, drawing, and software tools. Methods of hand drawn animation, rotoscoping, keyframe animation, video, and compositing will be covered. The emphasize learning through the act of creating. The development of technical skills (by software and by hand) will be expected, but this course focuses directly on making contemporary art and design. This course will give students and insight on the making of the many videos that they have seen as well as allow students to be able to create their own animation/video. This is a course for students that are interested in further learning about the digital arts and video editing.

Expectations and Policies
